Best friends forever

But what happens if one moves away?

When we returned from vacation, Gabe's cubby was empty, his photo was gone – and so was Gabe. It wasn't the first time a friend moved away, I reminded my son. His eyes widened and his mouth trembled, a sign that tears were on the way.

Adults in an increasingly mobile society know that families move – more than ever in human history, as the experts tell us. But our children are not experts. The friendships that develop from intense, play-filled days are powerful in ways that humble the parent standing by the empty cubby. Is it possible or desirable to preserve these strong childhood friendships – or is this loss a part of growing up? Today, older children can maintain contact with friends via technology, but young ones are dependent on parents. Experts, such as Dr. Terry Brazelton, suggest that parents need to recognize that children's friendships are especially intense, and when friends move on – either to other towns or even other friends – the children left behind can be devastated. As parents, we need to take such situations seriously.
